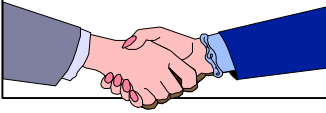

### Colt Engineering

As of January 4<sup>th</sup> 2002 Colt had reached 500,000 man-hours without a lost-time injury. Claude Mongrain attributed their success to constant reminding of safety to their employees in BBS, air quality surveys, Safety Meetings, drinking water testing, MSDS, PPE, a two-year safety-training program, ergonomics and a newsletter. A celebration and reward party has taken place.

### Basell Sarnia Site

We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Basell Sarnia whose contractors have recently completed two years without a single recordable incident. This represents 150,000 hours of work! All site employees and resident contractors received an emergency kit pouch with the Basell logo. Basell attributes their success to a comprehensive system of contractor safety meetings, safety incentives, and contractor reviews. They use BBS extensively and concentrate on providing positive feedback for a job well done. ## ONTARIO HAS LOWEST RATE

The latest federal figures show that the province of Ontario experienced the lowest deaths per 10,000 registered motor vehicles in Canada. However, Ontario was only average in personal injury rates at 121 injuries per 10,000 registered vehicles. More than one third of drivers and passengers killed in crashes were **not** wearing seatbelts. One fifth of the fatalities involved drivers that were legally impaired. Fewer crashes were recorded in rural areas, though they accounted for twice as many fatalities as the urban crashes.

### WHO IS THE SAFEST DRIVER IN CANADA?

The fatal crash rate is lowest among drivers who are age 55 to 64.

### ARE TEENAGERS THE WORST DRIVERS?

You might guess that it would be teenagers! Teen drivers represent 7% of all drivers, but are involved in 14% of all vehicle deaths. Car accidents are the leading cause of death for young people age 15 to 19, and two out of three are males. But the worst rate is for those people over age 65! (But only by a bit.)

### Were you born between May 21<sup>st</sup> and June 20<sup>th</sup>?

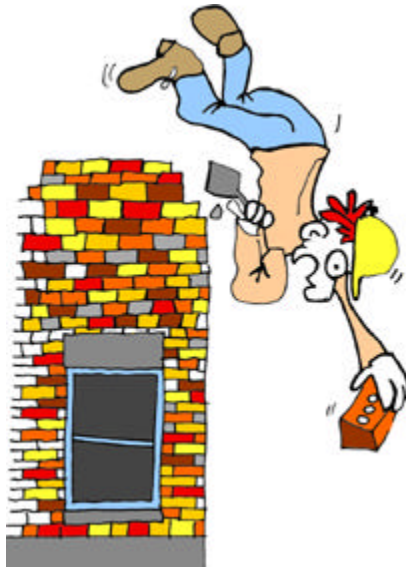
