SMOKE ALARM LAW TAKES EFFECT MARCH 1ST 2006

In about half of all fatal home fires in Ontario, the victims had no smoke alarm warning. In response to this statistic, working smoke detectors will be required on every level of every home as of March 1st.

This amendment to the Ontario Fire Code is in addition to the existing requirement, established in 1998 that a smoke alarm must be working in all sleeping areas of a home.

Smoke alarms are crucial life- safety devices which have existed for over 30 years. However, fire fatalities continue to occur in Ontario.

It is hoped that through a provincial-wide campaign to ensure that homeowners, landlords and tenants of residential occupancies are aware of the smoke alarm requirements, that compliance with the Fire Code will greatly increase public safety in Ontario.
