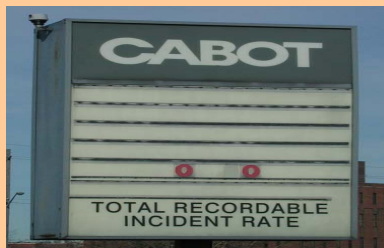

Gary Philips: Art of Safety (www.artofsafety.ca)

Consider a situation at work that's currently not working the way you'd like. Ask these six questions. Where does this indicate that attention is needed?

What's the Issue?

1) What's the standard?

- a. What is a good job, well done?
- b. In terms of: Safety? Quantity? Quality? Timeliness? Completeness?
- c. What is acceptable behaviour?
- d. What is unacceptable?

2) Is the standard reasonable? Is it clear?

3) Who is responsible to carry out the standard? Is that clear?

4) Can they do it?

- a. Is it a competency issue?
- b. Do they have the skills and knowledge?
- c. Is it an ability issue?

5) Do they do it?

- a. Is it a compliance issue?
- b. What's the frequency of non-compliance?
- c. Do you have reliable evidence?
- d. Would knowing why they don't do it give you useful information?

6) Are the necessary resources available?

- a. Time? Materials? Equipment? Authority? Budget?

Try this in your workplace and let me know your results!
