September 1, 2009:

MSA has determined that, when specific shells of the V-Gard® Protective Caps were being molded, there was a slight variation in the production process that caused added stress to the top of the shell.

We believe that a limited number of these helmets were affected. Even though these helmets were subsequently inspected and tested, the conditions that resulted for these particular shells did not become evident until after they had been exposed to ultraviolet (UV) or other environmental conditions.

We recommend that every helmet in service be inspected before and after each use to ensure that the helmet is not damaged.

MSA will replace any helmets that show damage to the top of the helmet relating to this manufacturing variation.
