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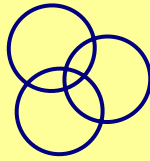

Ministry of Labour Targets MSD Hazards in Autumn Blitz

The Ministry of Labour (MOL) will conduct an inspection blitz on musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) from Sept 15 to Nov 15, 2010.

The MOL's blitz goals are threefold:

- 1) Enhance MSD enforcement efforts
- 2) Raise awareness of the importance of addressing MSDs
- 3) Identify prevention resources available to workplaces through their safe workplace association

MOL inspectors will look for hazards that put employees at risk for sprains and strains. Inspectors will pay particular attention to tasks requiring workers to use their muscles to exert force to lift, push or carry items.

Repetitive tasks will also be a focus of their attention. (Credit Workplace Safety & Prevention Service)
