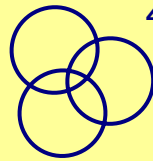

Safety Partnership Operational Committee

The Safety Partnership Operational Committee (SPOC) is comprised of the IEC General Manager and three senior managers from each of the three stakeholders, Plants, Contractors and Labour and is responsible for the implementation of strategic planning.

Meeting about six times per year this Committee will focus on improvement in safety and the ongoing improvement of the Safety Partnership's business model to ensure maximum productivity. The SPOC is overseen by the Executive Board and respective partners.

Some key responsibilities of the Operational Committee:

1. The ongoing improvement of safety in the Sarnia Lambton area;
2. Increasing productivity through standardization and optimization of safety standards;
3. Respond to issues/opportunities raised by the committees and remove barriers when needed;
4. Overseeing the committees reporting to them to ensure progress towards organizational goals;
5. Establishing and maintaining a positive organizational image;
6. Fostering a positive and truly caring culture;
7. Ensure reporting committees are properly resourced.

Safety Partnership Safety Committee

The Safety Partnership Safety Committee is comprised of approximately ten members from each of the three stakeholders, Plants, Contractors and Labour and is responsible to provide an advisory function with the focus on improvement in safety. This Committee is very similar to the previous Safety Partnership Steering Committee and plans to meet about six times a year as well.

This Safety Committee is overseen by the Operational Committee. Some key responsibilities include:

1. Monitor area safety statistics, near miss reports, metrics and look for opportunities to improve safety in the Sarnia Lambton area;
2. Identify opportunities for standardization of safety practices and communicate to the Operational Committee;
3. Fostering a positive and truly caring culture;
4. Take direction from the Operational Committee.

NOTE: This Committee's Terms of Reference are in draft mode and we welcome your feedback!

New Confined Space Entry/ Confined Space Entry Safety Attendant Course: This new Standard & Course will launch July 1, 2011 and be valid for a period of three years.

This course covers the roles and responsibilities of the Confined Space Entrant as well as the duties of the Confined Space Safety Attendant.

Safety Attendant (ME, HW, SA):

A separate Safety Attendant course will train workers in Safety Attendant roles and responsibilities with respect to Mobile Equipment, Hot Work and Supplied Air Safety Attendant. This course has a three year expiry and will take effect July 1, 2011
